Nebraska Quilters Mourn Loss of Dear Friend Sara Rhodes Dillow - NSQG Legacy Continues After Founder's Death

On Friday, February 8, 2008, Nebraska quilters and those around the world lost a dear friend, Sara Rhodes Dillow, 67, of Fremont, Nebraska. Sara was Nebraska State Quilt Guild's organizer and our first president in 1986. She had a passion for quilt collecting, making art quilts, and sponsoring learning opportunities for other quilters, as well as gardening, birding, and being outdoors.



Those who knew her well spoke of her as a global thinker, a "go-to" person, and having a "get it done" attitude. She was involved in many activities besides quilting and loved attending football games, concerts, and family events.

Sara held a degree in Home Economics from the University of Nebraska and was married for 40 years to Dr. Byron Dillow, who preceded her in death in 2002. She is survived by one daughter and two sons, and their spouses, and six grandchildren. Sara had recently retired as the Acquisitions Coordinator for the International Quilt Study Center at UNL. In 1994 she was inducted into the NSQG Hall of Fame. She authored the book *Repiecing the Past*. Her daughter said, "For a woman who never had a passport, we had to notify a lot of people around the world that she had died." She will be missed by so many. (An article by Paulette Peters describing Sara and her contributions to quilting was printed in the NSQG February 2006 newsletter, p. 5.)

President's Message



Dear Members,

Although I am weary of the cold and snow and am eagerly anticipating warm spring days ahead, I've made good use of my cold-bound time at home to work on those "goals" I set for myself.

If you remember from the last newsletter I introduced you to my quilting "one-for-two formula". Meaning I don't start a new project until I've finished two. So far I've finished 12 projects and have started three new quilts. Now, don't think this means that I'm anywhere close to diminishing that UFO (unfinished objects) pile. To be honest, I have many more UFOs waiting than I can count, *not to mention starting new projects!*

Talking about starting new quilt projects reminds me of the time I took my granddaughter, Alia, (then age 5) to the quilt store. While I was shopping for fabric to start a new project, I told Alia she could pick out *one* fat quarter to add to her stash – I wanted to keep her quilting juices flowing. When I was ready to check out I asked her to add her fat quarter to my pile. To my surprise she handed me not one fat quarter, but *four!* I said, "Oh, Alia, maybe you should finish the quilt you're working on first before buying more fabric." She looked up at me with her big blue eyes and replied, "But Grandma, I want to be just like you! When I finish my quilt I want to have fabric ready for my next one." Well, what could I say except – "Then you better go pick out two or three more!"

Isn't it a pleasure to pass on the joy of quilting to the next generation? The enthusiasm and fresh perspective from a new quilter never fails to renew my love of the art. When I think back to all the beginning quilters I've met, I realize that not one QNE passed by that I didn't meet someone just starting on their journey with quilting. QNE provides a great opportunity to renew friendships (and make new ones), take classes, shop at the merchant's mall, experience laughter, and fun (particularly during the live auction), and my favorite, maintenance-free great food (no cooking or dishes to clean-up)!

This year's QNE in Chadron July 24th-27th is on track to be spectacular. Make sure and read the articles on Quilt Nebraska 2008 and the IQSC Pledge Fundraising Plans for QNE. As for my contribution, I'm donating a quilt honoring the King Of Rock and Roll - Elvis! I've heard a rumor that the King is planning on making an appearance at QNE! So save that loose change and start making plans to attend QNE 2008 in Chadron – it's going to be memorable.

Thinking about what makes something memorable reminds me of the quilters who have inspired and encouraged me in my quilt journey. Do you know someone who has been a similar inspiration to you? Quilt Study Fund

Have you seen our Quilt Study Fund total? I am so proud of each and every one of you who has helped us reach this portion of our pledge to the International Quilt Study Center & Museum. You're probably wondering --- how could our pledge be this large already? This past year, 2007, we developed several projects to help us raise these pledge funds. The projects began at Quilt Nebraska '07 when we held a Live Auction, exchanged epb Pot Holders, began the sale of IQSC/NSQG T-shirts (to date 222 t-shirts and 53 sweatshirts have been sold), and the Baltimore Album Redone" project. At Threads Across Nebraska, a Silent Auction was added. The NSQG Board has earmarked the profits from Threads Across Nebraska and our NSQG Raffle Quilt to our pledge as well as it's Annual Memorial donation. Many members spent countless hours and great effort to carry out these projects. A Special Thanks to those individuals. The Signature Quilt (to date, it holds 270 signatures) and the Donor Book are on-going. The sale of IQSC/NSQG shirts will end May 1, 2008.



To date, **\$100,768.83** has been collected for the NSQG Pledge of \$150,000 to the International Quilt Study Center & Museum. Thank You for supporting our many projects for this pledge!

In 2008, new activities will begin. Jan Sears is organizing fund raising projects for QuiltNebraska '08. Her article is on page 5. I will organize the sale of Gingher scissors. Information about these scissors will be provided in the convention packets. Please consider ordering some scissors. You will receive your order at QuiltNebraska '08. If you are unable to attend the convention, please add the postage fee and you will receive them by mail. *Members we have received 2/3rds of our pledge!* We have less than 2 years left to complete the last third. Did you have any idea that we could develop into a fund raiser? I look forward to seeing you at Chadron!

The convention packets for our QNE 2008 will be arriving in your mailboxes shortly! I hope you are all planning on joining us for this exciting event. We have some special attractions to lure you all to attend! We have the ten national teachers that we announced last summer in Omaha. We are having keynote speeches BOTH Friday and Saturday night – Friday night will be Marsha McCloskey and Saturday night will be Ami Simms.

Chadron State College campus has hosted two previous Nebraska State Quilt Guild conventions. Renovations have been going on for your comfort – and the package cost for our convention is reasonable because with attendees staying on campus in the dorms, the food costs and conference fees can be kept low also. The room set up is 4 people in a suite, sharing a shower and stool area, but each of the two rooms in that suite has their own sinks. All the linens are provided as part of the economical room rate.

Friday and Saturday there will be a two-day class on **Wax Batik** taught by sisters Sue Chaffee and Cathy Audley. On Friday and Saturday there will be a two-day class taught by Vi Columbe of South Dakota on **Lone Star**. On Thursday and Friday, back by popular demand, an encore of Peg Pennell's class on **Free Motion Appliqué with Embellishments**.

Quilt History Day, on Thursday, July 24th, will feature **Bobbie Aug** as our lecturer. Bobbie is a nationally known quilt judge, teacher and lecturer from Colorado Springs. Bobbie is a certified AQS quilt appraiser and will be sharing her knowledge in her presentation entitled **“Detecting the Date”**, complete with extensive handouts. Bobbie has co-authored eight books and lectured extensively in the United States. In addition to being a contemporary quiltmaker and collector, Bobbie also collects antique quilts and is a full-time quilt scholar. Bobbie will be teaching a full-day class on **Antique and Vintage Fabric Study**, and also teaching a full-day workshop.

Aie Rossman will be another of our National Teachers. Aie is originally from Burma, and Southeast Asian influences can be seen in many of her quilt designs and color schemes. She is an architect who began designing quilts while taking a break from her professional career to raise her two children. Aie lives in Calgary, Canada and teaches both needle-turn and machine appliqué internationally at quilt shops and retreats. Her unique patterns are available through her company, Lotusland's, and she is publishing a book soon through AQS. Aie will be teaching two one-day classes for us – **“Machine Appliqué with Decorative Stitches”** and **“Needle-Turn Appliqué”**.

Linda Potter of Overland Park, KS, will be joining us to teach her method of simultaneously combining a variety of hand quilting stitches with appliqué, beading, embroidery and Sashiko from her book **“Quilt & Embellish in One Step!”** Workshop goers will use bold embroideries, in thick colorful threads, to yield elegant, fast results. Her two workshops will include learning techniques, learning to choose materials, and supplies that affect the success of this technique, plus beads and beading techniques will be discussed and demonstrated. Linda's **“Needle Magic”** will offer quiltmakers an alternative to Fine Hand Quilting and Machine Quilting.

Our tenth National Teacher is **M'Liss Rae Hawley** of Whidby Island, Washington. M'Liss is an accomplished quilting teacher, world-wide lecturer, embroidery and textile designer, and author of 11 books. One workshop she is teaching is the cover **Kaleidoscope** quilt from her newest book “M'Liss Rae Hawley's Scrappy Quilts” being published May 2008. M'Liss has a new television show on PBS, and is known for her fat quarter quilts and innovative designs. She likes to break quilting down to the basics to show students that quilting can be easy and fun at any level of skill! Her second full-day class will allow students to choose between two patterns – **“Danish Square”** and **“Portuguese Tiles.”**

We hope the combination of a reasonable price tag, the outstanding classes, and the teachers that we have lined up for you to enjoy will entice you to join us in the Pine Ridge for 3 days – or 4 if you attend the Quilt History Day – of fun, meeting old friends, and learning more about quilts and the love of quilt-making that we all share.

NEBRASKA STATE QUILT GUILD - Condensed Minutes Board and Committees - February 9, 2008 - Seward Memorial Library, Seward, NE

Carol Kusek, 2007 President, called the meeting to order at 9:36 am. Carol Kusek shared news of the death of Sara Dillow and then passed the gavel to Bea Bauerle, 2008 President. Bea Bauerle presented Carol with a certificate, gold gavel, gold thimble and a quilt, "Quilt of Many Colors". Carol Kusek presented certificates, thank yous and small gifts to the 2007 board members and committee chairs.

SECRETARY'S REPORT: Minutes of the previous meeting were approved via email with the following corrections in the report of Region III: the spelling of LaVonne Dunnetts and the addition of "Eight new 2007 NSQG memberships were received."

TREASURER'S REPORT: Susan Seidel presented the 2007 fourth quarter assets: checking accounts totaling \$35,282.39; savings balance of \$26,409.34 and CD's totaling \$45,436.98 for total assets of \$107,128.71. Dedicated 2007 Quilt Study funds totaled \$67,638.53 from savings of \$14,744.17 and a CD of \$52,894.36. Susan reviewed the 2007 year-end financial report by categories: total income \$57,152.85; total expenses (\$37,344.31); net income \$19,808.54; checking account balances of \$35,282.39; savings account balance of \$26,409.34; CD's totaling \$45,436.98 and a final balance of \$107,128.71 as of 12/31/2007. Total combined assets as of 12/31/2007 are \$174,767.24. NSQG Quilt Study Fund figures for the 2007 fourth quarter are \$4,802.10 and 2007-year totals are \$40,336.83. 2008 first quarter totals are \$18,138.91 and total contributions since 2005 are \$98,882.97 as of 1/29/08.

*Nancy Shavlik moved the board approve the Treasurer's report. Barb Hinrichs seconded - motion carried.

DISTRICT DIRECTOR'S REPORTS

Region I: No Report **Region II:** Nancy Shavlik presented information on a quilt gathering in Neligh on April 25, 2008, "If Quilts Could Talk" by Ruby and Louise from Mitchell, SD. **Region III:** No Report.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Quilt Nebraska 08: Cindy Scheinost and Sandy Hanson submitted a proposed budget for QNE 2008 based on 325 participants. Funds may be advanced, as needed upon request, to cover expenses prior to convention.

Quilt Nebraska 09: Merikay Gengenbach will contact Carol Brandl to check convention, establish a timeline/plan and review the letter of agreement. Discussion was held on considering a paid convention planner on the NSQG board in the future. No action was taken.

Awards: Members were reminded to get nomination forms in. Previous award winners will be listed in the February 2008 newsletter.

Bylaws and Policies: Sheila Beins will make copies of the most recent bylaws and policies and distribute to board members, committee chairs and all QNE planning notebooks.

Education: Sheila Green has *Discover Nebraska* packets available. If anyone finds or has a new education idea, she will investigate using it.

Historian: New committee chair, Beth Guth, asked that articles, photos, etc., of events be sent to her.

Library: The 2008 library book has been ordered and deals with photo transferring. 292 books are distributed. It was suggested Jan Sears consider "Going West! Quilts and Communities", by Roderick Kiracofe and Sandi Fox in the future. This might be an opportunity to use monies for special projects from donors

or as a NSQG special project once the IQSC obligation is met.

Marketing: A 2008 marketing committee chairman and marketing ideas are needed.

Membership: Darice Cecil reported current membership at 607 not including complimentary memberships. 956 newsletters have been ordered to cover the 349 members from 2007 as yet non-renewing membership, current membership and (6) complimentary copies. Discussion was held on changing the renewal period to eliminate unnecessary printing of the newsletter to October, due by December. New membership brochures are ready for distribution.

Raffle Quilt: Darice Cecil reported 3,340 tickets have been sold and 1,660 are left. The quilt has been displayed in Lincoln and will be in McCook, Omaha and Nebraskaland Days.

Quilt Nebraska Site Selection: Chris Steinke and Claudia Kiser reported that the Omaha Doubletree would not be available in 2012; alternative sites are being investigated.

Nebraska State Fair: Committee chair (white glove coordinator) is needed. There are two components to the quilt show: a) scheduling the white gloves and b) hanging/transporting, pipe & drape, layout, 4H coordination, takedown and checkout. It was suggested to ask for a white glove coordinator at the next Lincoln Quilt Guild meeting.

"Threads Across Nebraska": The written report submitted by Fay Kliever was read. The event center has raised the amount of money they will require from each ticket; therefore, admission costs have been raised. Carol Kusek will check on displaying the quilt winners from 4-H.

IQSC Pledge Fund Committee: Sandra Kosch reported that the shirt project would conclude May 1, 2008, and to date has sold 219 t-shirts and 53 sweatshirts. As of 2/9/2008, the QSF has a total of \$99,583.97. Donations sent by guilds need to contain location or contact information for proper receipt credit.

Website: Chris Wieggers presented information for consideration under new business.

Surfin Stitchers: No report.

Unfinished business: Members were reminded to submit all expenses using the form in their folders. If anyone receives money, contact Susan Seidel for a deposit form.

NEW BUSINESS:

Goals: Bea Bauerle presented and reviewed her goals for 2008: I - Continue "Quilt Gatherings" in each region and expand the number offered in the larger regions; II - Work with the membership chairman to lower numbers of members not renewing and to get new members by sending follow-up letters to non-renewing members and complimentary newsletters to guilds along with other new ideas; III - Encourage local guild involvement with NSQG by regional reps or the President visiting or corresponding with local guilds or presenting programs; IV - Expand the quilt education programs into more of our schools; V - Continue to improve the newsletter through development of a newsletter advisory committee comprised of the Advisor, President-elect, Secretary, Membership Chairman and a Member-at-Large.

Budget Meeting Expenses: Meeting held January 12, 2008. No expenses.

Newsletter Committee: The purpose of the committee is to determine an agenda of communication and education goals to be expressed from the board to the members of

NSQG; to function in an editorial capacity by reviewing and evaluating articles included in the newsletter, as well as provide guidance for article placement; and assist in soliciting advertising as needed. This will allow the board to stay on top of all the communication/educational information that are shared with NSQG members via the newsletter and provide oversight to a contracted service with NSQG. Current committee members are Carol Kusek, Merikay Gengenbach, Kandy Adams, Darice Cecil, and Laura Franchini.

Newsletter Distribution: The membership and website committee chairs asked the board to consider approving an electronic distribution of the newsletter based on surveyed responses from 2007 and 2008 membership. The method of electronic distribution for the newsletter was discussed. Hard copies of the February and April newsletter will still be sent to those requesting the newsletter electronically to cover any technical problems. Release of the electronic version will match the date the newsletter is sent to the post office.

*Susan Seidel moved to offer the newsletter electronically, via a website link, to those members who requested such a delivery format. (Members will be notified of the link via email when the newsletter is available for viewing. Nancy Shavlik seconded - motion carried.

Membership Proposal: Darice Cecil, Membership, proposed two new membership categories: businesses and guilds. The proposal was sent back to committee for rewording.

IQSC Museum Admissions for NSQG members: Carol Kusek presented information from Barbara Caron, Assistant Director of the International Quilt Study Center and Museum, regarding NSQG members receiving a discounted Museum admission rate. Carol was instructed to propose a 50% reduced rate special and inform the board of the response.

"Going West!" Books: The Smithsonian has provided 3 copies of the book, "Going West! Quilts and Communities" based on the exhibit held October 5, 2007 to January 21, 2008, at the Renwick Gallery of the Smithsonian American Art Museum featuring quilts from Nebraska. Discussion was held on where to place these books. One book will go to the International Quilt Study Center and the other locations will be determined at a later date.

2008 Budget: Susan Seidel presented the 2008 proposed budget. Estimated income is \$51,940.00 and expenses of (\$50,650.00) for a net income of \$1,290.00.

*Nancy Shavlik moved to accept the 2008 budget as presented. Merikay Gengenbach seconded - motion approved.

Quilt Nebraska 2008 budget: Cindy Scheinost and Sandy Hanson presented the QNE 2008 budget. Estimated expenses are \$89,651.00 and estimated revenue is \$90,000.00.

*Susan Seidel moved to accept the Quilt Nebraska 2008 budget. Nancy Shavlik seconded - motion carried.

Other Business: Carol Kusek shared that tabbing the newsletter results in a lower bulk mail price.

The next meeting will be April 12, 2008, at Quilters Cottage, Kearney. The meeting adjourned at 2:20 pm.

Discover Nebraska is a Quilting/Social Studies Unit geared to 4th graders studying Nebraskan History. This is the 2nd of a series of articles to acquaint you with the program.

In the 1800's, pioneers moved from the east coast westward. Why? Let's take a look at **The Pioneer Panel**. Perhaps they were attracted to free land, fewer people or had a sense of adventure. Most traveled by **Covered Wagon**. The wagon was pulled by horses or oxen. The people would walk along side. Wagons would cover only 10-20 miles per day. It held all their possessions: household goods, food, tools--everything needed to start a new life on the Plains. Our rivers are very important. The **Platte River** connects the blocks on the pioneer panel. Rivers are important for navigation, water for people or animals, and for our plants and trees. The eastern border of Nebraska is the Missouri River used by Lewis and Clark for navigation on their journey. Many pioneer trails (including the Mormon and Oregon Trails) follow the Platte River Valley. Nebraska is an Oto Indian word meaning "flat water." The Plains were called the "Great American Desert," now we're the breadbasket to the world. **Chimney Rock** in western Nebraska was mentioned more in the Pioneer's journals than any other natural formation. It is about 475' tall, shorter than it used to be due to erosion and lightning strikes. The North Platte River flows from Wyoming, the South Platte from Colorado and they meet near the city of North Platte.



New homes were needed. If they lived near a river and trees were plentiful, they usually built a log cabin. We have a traditional quilt block called the **Log Cabin**.

It became popular about the time of the Civil War, when sewing machines were patented by Elias Howe. Its center is a square, usually red, which denotes the fire (the center) of the home. It's surrounded by long narrow strips (logs) of fabric. Usually half the block is of darker colors, half lighter. There are many ways to arrange the blocks to make different designs. Another common shelter was the **Sod House**. Sod is dirt with plant material to hold it together. The sod was cut from the field using an implement called a **Plow** (on the Pioneer Panel). One acre of sod (a football field including the end zones) was needed to build a 16' x 18' home. The plow was pulled by a cow or ox or pushed by hand and also used to break up the soil to plant crops. The Homestead Act of 1862 offered free land if you built a home and farmed the land for 5 years. Forty-five percent of Nebraska was settled by homesteading (10% nationwide). Half of the homesteaders returned to the East coast. The hardships they faced included: grasshoppers, blizzard, drought, hail, fires, farm accidents, disease, crop failure, and loneliness! To combat loneliness they held barn dances, quilting bees, barn raisings, and various church and school activities.
