The Quilt Quest project is designed so the child can learn to make a quilt or apply the quilt concept to other skills that may include design techniques or applications to computers, painting, stained glass, photography, math, woodworking, careers, writing, and preserving. 4-H members are encouraged to take the project for many years with the target ages from 10-19 years and into adulthood. For the third year NSQG has awarded cash prizes of \$25 to 4-H participants in the Quilt Quest project who are chosen by the state fair judges to receive the award for their outstanding efforts in all areas of the project.

The purpose of the awards is to recognize outstanding workmanship, encourage participation in all aspects of the project curriculum, and create an awareness of the Nebraska State Quilt Guild's efforts around and within the state. Rewards to these children will perhaps lead to

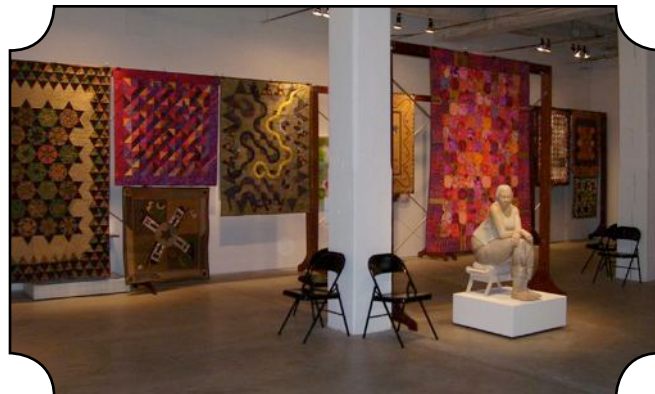

Delectable mountain blocks radiating from a center square form the piecing design of the 2009 NSQG raffle quilt. The peaks in the blocks, along with the event and location of the unveiling, QuiltNebraska 2008 at Chadron, motivated the naming of this piece—Pine Ridge Points.

It has traveled from the west end of the state to the east end of the state. Thanks to organizers of events at Cambridge, Cozad, Scottsbluff-Gering and the International Quilt Study Center in Lincoln for providing an opportunity to display the quilt and sell raffle tickets. The Dawson County Museum, Lexington, will show the quilt the first week of March where quilts made by Peg Bruns, maker of the raffle quilt, will be featured in a month long show.

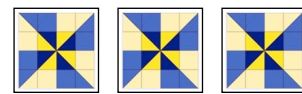

Our **Discover Nebraska** discussion concludes with this sixth installment.



The **Forest Pine Block** represents the Nebraska National Forest near Halsey, in the north-central part of the state. It is the Nation's only man made forest. It was hand planted, mostly by youth (4-H and Scout troops). Fire has destroyed it several times, but it has been replanted. Cattle graze nearby. Nebraska was known as the "Tree Planter's State," but that was changed to the "Cornhusker State" in 1945.

Nebraska's State Symbols: Our State bird is the **Western Meadowlark**, adopted by the Legislature in 1929. You will find them in grassy fields, meadows and prairies. It builds its nest on the ground. They have a distinctive black necktie around their throat with a bright yellow breast. Our paper pieced block was designed by Mildred Fauquet of Lincoln, NE. Nebraska's State flower is the **Goldenrod**. The loosely branched goldenrod heads begin blooming in late July. Some plants grow to 6' tall, frequently growing in ditches along the road. The goldenrod was named as the Nebraska State flower in 1895. Many consider the goldenrod to be a weed. The **Cottonwood Tree** block became the official state tree in 1972. The first state tree, the American Elm, was chosen in 1937. However, disease wiped out most of the Elms in the 1960's, so the Cottonwood was then chosen as the new state tree. Early explorers described the Nebraska Territory as a "great treeless plain." The homesteaders transplanted many trees, planting

many in the late 1800's. Arbor Day was established by J. Sterling Morton of Nebraska City in 1872. Both Goldenrod and Cottonwood Tree blocks were designed by Jan Stehlik, Dorchester, NE.

Last, but not least, on our Discover Nebraska quilt is our **Documentation** block. This is similar to a label on a quilt, but in this case, it's on the front of the quilt. Remember to document each of your quilts. On the label: include the maker's name and address, the date the quilt was made, the size of the quilt, and was the quilt made for a special occasion or a gift for a specific person? Was a special technique used? What was your inspiration? Labels can include photographs or other mementos. It's your quilt and you can include whatever you wish!

**Discover Nebraska** is a rewarding educational outreach program. It supplements the Social Studies curriculum as fourth graders study the history of the State of Nebraska.
